Admission Process

Complete application forms along with a color photograph (4 cm x 3 cm background should be Sky Blue jpg format), certified copies of your Birth certificate, Degree certificate/ Service certificates/ Internship completion certificate, and Bank payment receipt (You are requested to pay the application fee of Rs. 3,500.00 for the People's Bank, Borella Branch bearing account number 078-100122268432 with coursecode 38030-0242-3420051.) send by registered post or hand deliver the completed application form to the below- mentioned address on or before the closing date.

The applicant will be selected through an interview or aptitude test conducted by the Faculty of Indigenous Medicine.

Program Assessment Procedure:

The evaluation for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma of Indigenous Orthopaedic Treatment shall consist of continuous assessments (CA), end-semester examinations and the evaluation of a dissertation.

Each module will be assessed through continuous assessments and end-semester examinations. The end-semester examinations include written papers for each module. The grading scheme will be based on Grade Points (GP), with contributions from each semester forming the final GPA. A candidate's performance will be evaluated through a combined system of continuous assessments and end-semester examinations.

For the final grading of the program, continuous assessments and end-semester examinations will be marked according to the following allocation:

- End-of-Semester Examination: 60%
- Continuous Assessment: 40%

A candidate must achieve a minimum of 50% of the marks allocated for each component of the assessment, i.e., the end-semester examination and continuous assessment for each module.

Breakdown of marks for the final assessment of the research component:

- Conducting research work: 30 marks
- Research presentation: 30 marks
- Dissertation: 40 marks
