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Introduction

- 2. To critically evaluate the area of interest selected for the elective
- 3. To suggest one's own solutions to the problems / issues identified based on critical evaluation
- 4. To take responsibility for one's own learning
- 5. To broaden own perspective of life

Eligibility for admission

The elective program at the faculty of Indigenous Medicine, University of Colombo is administered by the Deans office and coordinated by the faculty coordinator of the International Unit, University of Colombo. Students that are registered to a recognized Ayurveda medical or allied health science degree in an overseas university or medical school are eligible to apply.

The applicant should possess basic knowledge and prior experience in the discipline in which he/she has applied to do an elective.

A supporting letter from Dean/Director or a competent authority of the registered institute should be sent along with the application.

Overview of attachments

All programs are open for application throughout the year. Admission to a relevant appointment depends on whether the Head of the Department concerned can provide the necessary facilities or supervision during the requested period.

Elective candidates will be attached to the relevant departments according to their selected program and will follow departmental guidelines during the placement.

During the training students will be exposed to various clinical conditions according to the relevant tropics. The student will have the opportunity to be engaged in history taking (most cases are comfortable communicating in English), Physical examination (under supervision), observe Ayurveda treatment procedures, and case-based discussions.

Also, students will be engaged in herbal garden tours, drug development procedures, and teaching based on simulators, slides, specimens, and other teaching learning materials available in the relevant departments. Further, to be an observer of cadaveric dissections in the Anatomy laboratory and practical sessions at the laboratories of other departments.

Duration of the elective appointment

Minimum period will be 02 weeks.

Maximum duration will be 03 months.

Completion of the program

At the end of the program students will be expected to write a reflection on their experience and what they learned in the course. Candidates who successfully complete the course will receive a letter of completion.

Accommodation

Students will have to find accommodation on their own as the faculty does not fulfill accommodation requirements. However, accommodation facilities are available close to the university. Food is available in the university canteen.

Dress code

Dress in smart professional attire and wear a white hospital coat at all times. Casual wear (i.e. shorts, t shirts and flip flop) is not permitted.

Fees

Registration fee (nonrefundable) – 30 USD

Tuition fee per week - 70 USD

Refund

If you wish to cancel your elective, please kindly contact us immediately. If you notify at least 2 weeks before the start of the elective, any paid elective fees will be refunded. The refund process could take up to 3-4 months. No refund will be given if notification is received less than 2 weeks before the start of an elective or if you withdraw after the elective has begun. There will be no refund of elective fees for students who have to terminate their electives due to any disciplinary action.

Attendance

The relevant Department will attempt to contact those absent for 2 consecutive days and if there is no response, the unit will inform their university regarding their absence.

How to apply

Application form can be downloaded by the faculty website. You can select up to 03 elective appointments in different disciplines in the order that you would prefer to carry them out. However, the placements will be offered on availability.

Attach a professional photograph and a letter from the Dean of your medical school confirming your student status and email along with your application form to dean@fim.cmb.ac.lk

Process after application

All incomplete applications will be rejected at the time of submission or at the time of processing.

Decision on completed application is depend on many factors such as department, elective type, duration, demand at that time, exams time in our faculty, vacations and teaching resources available.

Application processing time would be from 3 - 12 weeks.

The first notification of acceptance will be the conditional acceptance letter which will be sent to the applicant. In the conditional acceptance letter, you will be requested to pay the fee and submit documents/information before the deadline.

Once you pay, you will receive a payment confirmation letter and elective confirmation letter from the faculty.

Prior to your arrival you should send us the confirmed arrival date to facilitate your elective appointment in the department. Please note that you should bring true copies of the payment slip, the Deans letter and two photographs.
