CLUB MEMBERSHIP

Membership strategy

As a Chartered club Rotaract club of Institute of Indigenous Medicine University of Colombo has its 1st conception of members into the club. With the dawn of the memberships into the club, Membership Development and retention played an important role. As a Brand-new experience for all the members the most important strategy we used during the year was fellowship and Innovation. Through innovative projects we kept our membership in line with Rotaract and made most of our members to actively involve to gain experience and learn from it. Fellowship between all members , Developing skills, Adding memories , Sharpening abilities and Creating friendships were key factors that held within the club to keep the stability of the membership.

Induction process

As per the by laws the club followed a traditional procedure of inducting members. Based upon the backgrounds as stated below

- 1. A member may propose a candidate, a prospective member may make a request, or another club may propose one of its transferring or former members to join this club. The method of admitting new members of university-based Rotaract clubs shall have the approval of the appropriate school authorities.
- 2. The club should approve or reject a candidate's membership within 10 days and notify the candidate of its decision.

Additional qualifications or procedures for admitting new members may also be included here. A process to address objections raised by current members may also be included here

Termination

As per the club by laws, each member of this club shall attend at least Eighty 80% of this club's regularly

scheduled meetings. If so the respective member will be informed via an official mail or communication before 3 months of termination regarding the risk of his/her membership termination. In absence of continuous presence in clubs meeting and project after a period of three months the membership of the respective member shall be terminated with notice.

Project Description -

Utilize is a skill development program which focus all the rotaractors of institute of indigenous medicine and none rotaractors as well. 

The students usually find references/ study in the library but due to the current pandemic situation, that option is unavailable. This project aims to help them overcome their challenges and solve their problems up to a possible extent. The plan is to continue as a yearly project widening the scope gradually, year by year. As a newly initiated club, we decided to focus on one school this year, for the sake of maintaining sustainability. The initially planned subjects were Science, Mathematics and English, on the request of students ICT also was added.

The GCE Ordinary level examination is one of the most crucial examinations in deciding the career for most Sri Lankan students. The performance in the exam depends on the skill of identifying and writing answers to questions asked. While some students master this skill with relative ease, others have a difficult time. Through the past paper discussions, we will be training them and providing the necessary practice to develop this adequately

The revision sessions will focus on revising the important lessons and lessons which require more effort to attain competency, we will provide necessary short notes in this regard. We will also encourage and show them how to use the internet for their academic purposes in a proper way. For practicals, we will select YouTube videos and edit them with Sinhala audio, as the beneficiaries find it difficult to understand English videos We have identified that the beneficiaries have colourful ambitions but most of them do not have a clear idea of the path on how to achieve them. The career guidance sessions will focus on guiding them on this matter. The motivational sessions will focus on keeping the students motivated in academic activities in wake of the current pandemic situation, through which they are most likely to lose interest in studies.

Project "NAADI"


Project Description

This project is a drug cultivation programme initiated by Rotaract Club of Institute of Indigenous Medicine University of Colombo targeting promotion of herb cultivation. The key motive of this project is to support and create awareness within the society regarding drug cultivation and creating demanding for herbal drugs while uplifting the value of herbal drugs through organic cultivation. The project is conducted in two phases. The first phase is the cultivating herbs in Ayurvedic Hospitals. First of them, it is the National Ayruvedic Teaching Hospital in Borella. By using the free lands in these hospitals, we cultivate different essential shortage drugs . The second phase is the cultivating most essential medicinal plants like Heen Bin kohomba, Babila, Heen aratta in the Weligatta Modern Herbal Garden by collecting seeds from many areas in the country through students of the Institute of Indigenous Medicine. According to the instructions of resource persons, seeds are planted in nurseries at the garden of Institute premises, by the committee members, to transport them to Waligaththa after become seedlings. And then distributing the plants to unemployed people and farmers in waligaththa area until getting the harvest. After the harvest, i donate them to the Hambantota Ayurveda Hospital and sell the rest to the other drug stalls in Hambantota Areas.



Phase One

Following the survey done and discussion of the case study, meetings among the host clubs confirmed the lapse in the awareness of mothers on key areas of contraception, immunization and nutrition. Thereafter we discussed the methodologies to generate the awareness among the mothers. We finalized a panel discussion followed by a Q and A session among mothers to be the best method to bridge the lapses in knowledge.

The Rotaract Club, Medical Faculty following discussion with Obstetricians and Gynaecologist, Dr Mrs Niyas and Consultant Paediatrician Dr Wimalasena developed validated power point presentations consisting of necessary guides for the pregnant mothers and mothers with children under the age of five.

It was decided to conduct the awareness session with help of medical students of the University of Colombo as resource people. We took the initiative to invite 4 medical students as well finalizing the information to be shared during this event. The MoH was contacted and information to the villagers in Yatiyanthota was relayed via the MoH. Following discussion with the MoH and the villagers, a convenient day when availability worked on all parties was decided as 8th January 2022. The village temple was obtained as the venue for the event following discussion with the head priest and it was made ready for the awareness session in Yatiyanthota.

On the day of the programme, the clubs travelled to Yatiyanthota after making arrangements for the awareness session including projectors, laptops, sheets of paper to be distributed for the Q and A session and refreshments.

The awareness session was completed on the 8th of January, 2022 with the participation of medical students from the University of Colombo as resource persons, and the Rotaract Clubs of American National College (ANC), Achievers Lanka Business School, NIBM, Colombo, Colombo Uptown, Colombo North, Faculty of Law - University of Colombo, Faculty of Med

icine - University of Colombo, Wellawatte, Singer Sri Lanka, NSBM, Institute of Indigenous Medicine - University of Colombo and Saegis Campus. There were 50+ participants from the community (Pregnant mothers and Mothers with children under the age of 5) Following areas were covered.

- Contraception
- Immunization
- Nutrition
- Growth and Development





This was followed by a question and answer session with regards to Maternal and Child Health. The Q and A session was successfully mediated. Common myths and misconceptions were tackled during the Q and A session including the following

- Cancer Risk with Contraception
- Disease risk with Vaccination
- Nutritional myths and misconceptions among pregnant women when it came to meats and specific fruits
- Superiority of Formula over Breast Feeding

Contact details of the mothers who present were gathered in order to share further knowledge in the future. In addition, we also requested the mothers to carry forward the information to their families and friends to ensure there is continuous spread of the correct knowledge. The contact detail of a representative from the Medical Faculty was shared so the participants had the opportunity to pursue further information especially private problems that some mothers had. Some such issues that came up included:

- 1. Immune compromised child who required information on available services for her kid
- 2. Child with cleft palate who was referred to Lady Ridgeway hospital

Following the session, we received positive feedback from the participants and the MoH clinic. The awareness session concluded with a fellowship break in the river of Yatiyanthota.





The second phase planning of Project Maathru was finalized during the first phase, where multiple problems and solutions to be executed were suggested by the contact points and locals of Kithulgala. Later after the a visit, the team had few discussions regarding the issues identified and the respectieve feasible solutions. The most important problem that was identified was the shortage of seating capacity for pregnant mothers who visit the clinic for regular checkups. The seating capacity was only 16, while the count of patients going for checkups on a specific day during a specific time slot is above 30. In order to overcome this challenge, the team analysed and decided to build an extension of the building using the space availble near the main clinic. Even though the area had to be cleaned and also the waterline passing by to be changed, we prcoeeded to do so due to ease of access from the waiting area to the clinic. After communicating to the midwife that we will be proceeding to build the extension, we started searching for a local construction team and then proceeded to get an estimate to complete the entire extension.

With the help of nearby locals and midwife, a construction team was hired for the project. Parrellarly in order to raise funds, a marketing porposal was made to approach potential donors and sponsors. ALso the clubs agreed to contribute a part of the sum to be collected. Soon as the initial set of funds started collecting, by making an initial payment of the construction crew, the work for building the extension area began. After few weeks, our team visited the venue to see the progress and what else was required for completion of the extension. With two more payments done, a sum of 308,000 Rs has been made to the construction crew and the extension area is closing to completion. The raw materials for the project have been purchased from a local hardware shop close to the clinic.

Due to the current economic crisis and inflation of the country, the prices of Raw Material and Labour expenses have risen up, which eventually increases the previous estimate made for the project. The project is now on hold as the financial requirments to be settled to the consturction team is pending for the completion of the building. The project team is actively searching for potential donors to raise the funds and comeplte the project. The extension of the building is expected to be completed in the month of November 2022 and planned to have an opening ceremony of the building too.






